Notes from the Secretary/Treasurer

On March 19, 2011 Nu Chapter met at the Four Points by Sheraton in Ann Arbor, enjoying another wonderful brunch buffet.

The meeting was called to order at 10:17am by President Nicole Love. Past President Laura Roth read the Purpose and History of Sigma Phi Alpha.

Six junior students invited to attend were asked to introduce themselves.

President Love read the qualifications for general, faculty, and honorary membership. Wendy Kerschbaum introduced senior Kathryn Brown, Dina Korte introduced senior Patricia Walch, Anne Gwozdek introduced Degree Completion candidate Allsion Restauri, Wendy Kerschbaum introduced faculty candidate Anne Gwozdek and Karen Ridley introduced our Honorary candidate Becky Lewis. New members were inducted.

Becky spoke briefly about the new Hope Clinic and their need for volunteers.

The 2010 meeting minutes as written in the newsletter were approved.

The annual report was read by the Secretary/Treasurer.

ePostcard filed with IRS. Supreme Chapter notified to maintain active status. As of the first of 2011 we had \$858.54 in our account. This balance reflects 2011 dues to Supreme Chapter of \$75, the ordering of six keypins for \$180, and three of our donations: Hope Clinic \$150, Washtenaw Children's Dental Clinic \$150, and Relay for Life \$150. Since the first of January we've made a \$300 donation to Research Day - Hygiene Awards and ordered five certificates for new inductees for \$75.

Invitations/Newsletters were mailed to 56 members - 23 inactive - 3 were also emailed. Invitations - Newsletters were emailed to 93 members. As of Friday the 18th we had received 46 dues paying responses - one from the "missed you" list! We also received enough sponsorship money to pay for 8 and a half brunches.

Cost for mailings = \$90.81, \$3.48 for a package of paper, \$55.30 for ink cartridges, \$2.99 for a box of envelopes, and \$29.04 for stamps. This leaves us with \$1,742.47 in our account prior to paying for brunch.

Old business: Sarah Hughes was not present to report on the U-M DH website and linking with Sigma Phi Alpha - Nu Chapter.

The winners of the 2011 Research Day Hygiene Awards was read by Dina Korte. One of the juniors present today, Janet Zalucha, was the recipient of the Audience Award.

Dina Korte passed our scrapbook upkeep to Patricia Walch. Kudos Dina for your work.

Beverly Gainer will continue with the Newsletter.

Suggestions were made to use Facebook for member contact, sending out a Save a Date for our annual meetings, creating an email address book and using Carrie Towns to update and keep us current with addresses for our members.

Anne Gwozdek will continue to be our contact with the *DentalUM*.

<u>New Business:</u> The meeting date for 2012 was set for the 10th of March at the Sheraton with the buffet as presented today.

Connie nominated Wallin McMinn DDS for honorary membership. Alaina Robinson elaborated on him. His nomination was approved.

Wendy Kerschbaum suggested we send a sympathy card to honorary member Dean Kotowicz, whose 34 year old son died in a car accident.
