Shannon O'Dell – Honorary

The museum is one of only a handful of dentistry museums in the world and has a collection of more than 15,000 catalogued items, with artifacts dating from the 18th century to present day. Shannon is our 3rd curator and assumed the position in 2004 after a year of being the assistant curator.

As curator, Shannon oversees all operations and management of the museum, including the collections, exhibitions, programs and tours, administration and communications. No small task!

When I asked Shannon what she enjoys most about her position as curator, she explained how much she enjoys learning the personal history behind each item. You see, Shannon thrives to preserve the "story" connected with each artifact because ultimately it describes the history of our profession, our culture and will help sustain our longevity.

The Division of Dental Hygiene is especially grateful for Shannon's dedication to our profession. It was in 2012 when Shannon was in the middle of preparing an exhibit entitled, "Women Dentists: Changing the Face of Dentistry" that she learned that our profession, dental hygiene, would be celebrating our 100^{th} anniversary the following year. I quote Shannon here when her reaction to learning that dental hygiene had a significant birthday in 2013 was, "We have to do something with this!"
