Notes from the Secretary/Treasurer

On March 25th, thirty six of us gathered for brunch at Weber's in Ann Arbor to welcome new members and conduct our annual meeting.

Vice President Jennifer Forgacs called the meeting to order at 10:30am. She thanked everyone for bringing donations for Safe House, a facility in A2 that provides support for those impacted by domestic violence or sexual abuse.

Jen asked Hope Woolley to read the Purpose and History of Sigma Phi Alpha. She then called on Dina Korte to introduce our junior guests. She also welcomed Sheree Duff on her transfer back to Nu Chapter.

Jen read the guidelines for faculty induction, induction by program, and honorary induction. Candidates were introduced and sworn in by the vice president. Introductions are shown previously.

Jen asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the 2016 meeting as printed in the 2016 Newsletter. Motion made and approved.

Beverly Gainer was asked to read the annual report.

Annual report:

We began 2017 with an account balance of \$1,869.87. Dues of \$100.00 were sent to Supreme Chapter. Four key pins were ordered, \$120.00; six certificates for new members, \$90.00; donations were sent to: Research Day Dental Hygiene Awards - \$300.00, Hope Clinic - \$225, and the Christine Klausner Scholarship Fund - \$200.00.

The ePostcard to the IRS was submitted, accepted and filed with the Supreme Chapter to maintain our active status.

Twelve invitations were mailed to new inductees and junior guests. Plus seven to general members without email. One hundred invitations were emailed. Two sheets of stamps - \$19.60; a new ledger book - \$13.43; and a box of small envelopes - \$1.06 were purchased. Forty Agendas were printed at FedEx - \$11.44. Total = \$45.53. I am considering these expenses my personal donation to the society this year.

Prior to the brunch expense there is \$1,744.95 in our account.

Moving on to Old Business

Lisa Dodge will continue to be our link to the U-M DH/SPA Website. (Google University of Michigan Dental Hygiene Program Sigma Phi Alpha Nu)

Connie MacKinnon announced the winners of our 2017 Research Day awards. See separate article on the winners.

Patricia Lengyel asked to be relieved of the scrapbook upkeep. No one volunteered, so Patricia graciously agreed to maintain the books for another year. PLEASE consider this position for next year.

Beverly Gainer agreed to continue doing the Newsletter but would welcome passing this task over to someone else.

Anne Gwozdek has retired and passed the liaison position of SPA-Nu/DentalUM over to Connie MacKinnon.

Donation sites will remain the same (Research Day DH Awards = \$300.00; Hope Clinic = \$225.00; Community Dental Clinic = \$225.00; VINA Community Dental Center = \$225.00; and the Christine Klausner Scholarship Fund = \$200.00), however, the amounts might have to be altered. Wendy Kerschbaum suggested that the Executive Committee meet to decide.

Sec/Treas Bev Gainer spoke about a decrease in sponsorship money and the dwindling of dues payments.

Several options were presented to alleviate this problem. One possibility was to make dues payable at a different time than with the annual invitation to the meeting. Another was to make it clearer in that invitation that dues were still payable even if you were not attending the meeting.

Rita Numan thought the younger members would respond better to an electronic form of payment. She will investigate this possibility and report her findings at a special meeting called for by the President.

It was motioned and approved to increase dues from \$15.00 to \$25.00.

New Member Amy Ravenga thought we could implement a spreadsheet to record dues rather than use a ledger book. She has offered her assistance in this endeavor.

Darlene Jones spoke about the need for carts for fluoride varnish delivery – Smiles for a Lifetime. Ellen Voss suggested passing the hat to raise money for this. The hat passing was a success – see separate note from Darlene. Also, note that we were able to increase our sponsorship money by \$105.00 by doing this.

Martha McComas thought the office of Secretary/Treasurer could be divided into two separate offices to lessen the burden of the one position and will present her ideas at the special meeting called for by the President.

For 2018 we will bring donations to our meeting from the Wish List of Alpha House.

In Memoriam: Melva Baxter, RDH

It is with sadness that we are letting you know that Melva Baxter, RDH, passed away on April 27th, 2017. Melva was a 1950 graduate of the University of Michigan (U-M) Dental Hygiene Program. A farm girl from Muir, Michigan, Melva graduated when Dr. Dorothy Hard was U-M Dental Hygiene Program Director. She was a proud member of Sigma Phi Alpha-Nu Chapter dental hygiene honor society. She had not missed an annual induction ceremony until 2017 when her health wouldn't permit her to attend.

Throughout her professional career Melva was always a staunch supporter of her profession of dental hygiene and her alma mater. She was extremely active in the American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA), the Michigan Dental Hygienists' Association (MDHA), and Central District Dental Hygienists' Society (CDDHS, now Central Region Dental Hygienists' Society), serving in leadership roles in all levels.

Her special gift to all of us was her preservation of our history. She served as Historian of MDHA for 24 years. Over the past decade, Melva also worked closely with Shannon O'Dell, curator of the U-M School of Dentistry Sindecuse Museum, Collections and Coordinator, Kathy Daniels. She contributed historic archives as well as photographs, stories, and timelines about dental hygiene and those played important roles in profession. Most recently, she served in an

advisory capacity in the development of one of the museum's current exhibits, "Dental Hygiene-A Century of Progress."
