

This position is a 20% administrative effort in Academic Affairs and reports to the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs. The Global Initiatives in Oral and Craniofacial Health Program Director (GIOCH) oversees the coordination and administration of all aspects of the GIOCH program including the following functions:

Responsibilities:

- 1. Identify and develop international agreements that are mutually beneficial and of high priority
- 2. Coordinate visits of foreign faculty, scholars and students to UMSoD
- 3. Explore globalization partnerships with other schools and colleges on campus and represent the School of Dentistry on university-wide activities in global affairs
- 4. Develop unique curricular and extracurricular opportunities for dental and dental hygiene students to participate in global initiatives programs enriching student's understanding in global health, cultural intelligence, creating sustainable and responsible community-based preventive programs, different health education models and health care systems
- 5. Encourage greater integration and coordination of students' global experiences with Pathways program and Support inter-professional education and care
- 6. Serve as an informational resource for faculty and students in the SoD who are pursuing international experiences and/or collaborations
- 7. Grow programs in a sustainable manner
- 8. Risk assessment and management
- 9. Plan the delivery of the overall program and its activities in accordance with the mission and the goals of the UMSOD.
- 10. Develop an annual budget and operating plan to support the program.

Qualifications

Required:

The individual must have a full-time appointment as an instructional or clinical track faculty member, at or above the rank of associate professor. Demonstrated leadership strengths including a track record of leadership training and experience, excellent communication skills, ability to set priorities and manage diverse teams of faculty and staff, collaborative style, creativity and innovation, effectiveness in teaching.

Preferred:

The preferred candidate will have experience in international programs, experience designing and implementing community health programs, and experienced international traveler. This is preferred but not required to apply for the position.
